Kansas Affairs, WASHINGTON, Feb. 22, 1856.

Intelligence was received by the Government this morning containing assurances that the Border Counties of Missouri would acquiesce in the present state of things in Kansas, and make no aggressive movement. The President instructed Gov. Shannon before leaving to visit these counties personally, and say if an invasion was attempted it would be resisted by all the power that he could command; also to say to the people of Kansas that the same authority would be exerted if any insurrectionary demonstration occurred.

If the Topeka Convention assembles a civil process will be sent out against the Governor and other officers, on the ground of the Territorial law that they are assuming functions to which they have not been legally elected or legally appointed. The same law prevails in most of the States. No military force will be employed unless the civil process is resisted. Republican instructions have been sent out by a special messenger, who started on Wednesday night, to members of the Topeka Convention, desiring them merely to organize and adjourn, so as to be prepared for any movements hereafter. With these precautions on both sides no collision is now apprehended.—Cov. Tribune.
