INTERESTING RELICS .- In Chagnaramous Bay, about ten miles to the west of the port of Spain, in the Island of Trindad, have been found, in about six fathoms of water, the remains of a Spanish fleet commanded by APADOCA, at the time the English expedition under HARVEY and ABERCROMEINE, sailed from Martinique for the subjection of that Island in 1797. The Spanish vessels were five in number-four line of battle ships and one frigate-all being perfect specimens of naval architecture, and which, for better protection, had been placed under cover of the guns and mortars of the Fort of Gasparillo. When the English fleet anchored within range A to preserving une impossibility of escape, without engaging, set his vessels on fire to prevent them falling into the hands of the enemy. the money having been landed on the opposite coast. 
