Lancaster Bank, Suspended. LANCASTER, Nov. 18.—The following notice was posted on the door of the Lancaster Bank this morning:

Notice: A run having been made on the Lancaster Bank, and its notes having been refused by the Philadelphia Banks, the officers deem it impossible to meet the liabilities of the Bank as they are presented, and are, therefore, compelled to close the Bank.

LANCASTER, Nov. 18.—The Lancaster Bank did not open its doors as usual this morning, and developments since made confirm the fears of our community that the stock of the Bank is greatly impaired.

Campbell, in 1818, he was appointed by the Governor as United States Senator from Tennessee, and subsequently elected by the Legislature for three successive terms, ending March 4, 1827, at which time he entered the Cabinet of Gen. Jackson as Secretary of War, and continued in the position until the disruption of that Cabinet in 1831, when Gen. Cass succeeded him.
