The state may contract debts, to supply causal deficits or failures in revenue, or to most expenses not others see protided for: but the appropriate amount of such debts, direct and contingent, whether contracted by virtue of one or more acts of the general assembly, or at different periods of time, shall never exceed saven hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and the money arising from the creation of such debts, shall be applied to the purpose for which it was obtained, or to repay the debts so contracted, and to no other purpose whatever.

To provide for the payment of the present debt, and any additional debt contracted we aforesish, the legislature shall, at its first session after the adoption of this amendment, create a sinking fund, which shall be sufficient to just the accraing interest on such debt, and annually to reduce the principal thereof by asom not less than two bradest and fifty themsand dollars; which sin-king fund hall consist of the net annual income of the public works, from time to time owned by the state, or the proceeds of the sale of the same or any part thereof, and of the income or proceeds of sale of stacks own-cby the state, together with other funds or resources that may be designated by law. The said sinking fund may be increased, from time to time, by assigning to it may part of the taxes, or other revenues of the state, not required for the ordinary and current expenses of government, and unless in case of war, tyvasion, or insurrection, no part of the said sinking fund shall be used or applied otherwise than in extinguishment of the public debt, and the amount of such debt is reduced below the sum of five millions of dollars. e over 500 of them now in use in Union and adjoining counties, we deem any further recommendation unnecessary.
