News Items from Other Counties.

TAMMARA, Feb. 18.—Messrs. J. Ed. Ward, Barnes and Dunnean Weir, mine agent, were suffocated by gas in the mine yesterday. Their bodies were taken out at eleven o'clock last night. Mr. Barnes was a Director of the Telegraph Company. Charlotte Jones and Henry Hays were lung at Pittsburgh last Friday for murder, both confessing their guilt, and Hays warning all persons to beware of using liquor, which had brought him there, Charlotte Jones died a horrible death her mind wildly excited and her body suffering as much as her mind. It is said she is the second woman ever executed in this country.

A fire in Brown township, Lycoming county, 1st inst., burned the house of Wm. Gamble to the ground. Caught in the roof from a stove pipe. A much needed revival of religion has been enjoyed in Hollidaysburg, during which 101 persons united with the Lutheran church, 86 with the Methodist, 59 with the Presbyterian, 39 with the Baptist, and meetings still continued.

Gov. Packer has signed the death warrants of Alexander Anderson and Henry Richards, convicted of the murder of Mrs. Garber and Mrs. Ream. They are to be hung on Friday, the 26th of April. The Danville Democrat says that at a meeting of creditors of this concern, held in the early part of last week, at Philadelphia, we learn, that the whole establishment—real estate, stock, &c., was transferred to them, and that they will carry on the works hereafter on their own account. A new company will be formed, and it is believed, that at least a portion of the works will be put into operation at an early day.

A man named Jacob Whitman, has been arrested at Williamsport and held to bail, on the charge of setting fire to the barn of Mr. Jos. Gilmory, recently consumed near that place. Mr. J. A. John E. Jones, of Williamsport, has received a Clerkship in the State Department, Harrisburg. SHOCKING ACCIDENT.—We regret to learn that the wife of Maj. DANIEL EISENHORN, of Lewisburg, was burned to death on Sunday evening last, by the explosion of a fired lamp. Maj. E. had his hands severely burned in his efforts to extinguish the burning element.

A gang of counterfeiters connected with that at Williamsport, has been broken up in McKean county. Gov. Packer has sent a requisition to the Governor of Ohio for the delivery up of Fred'k W. Porter, the late Secretary of the American Sunday School Union, who proved a defaulter some months ago.

On Tuesday week five men were horribly burned by the bursting of the stock at the Union Furnace, situated at Union Deposit, Dauphin county. Four of the injured persons have since died, and the other is not expected to survive his wounds.

On the 10th inst., a fire broke out in the house of Jacob Peter, at Crogrove's Hall, Snyder county, which burned to ashes, together with all its contents, such as furniture, meat, Carpenter's tools, and all their clothing, except such as they were wearing at the time. The fire originated from the stove pipe having been on fire. The loss is estimated at between four and five hundred dollars.

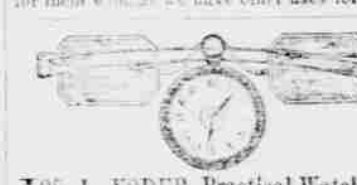
