News Items from Other Counties.

WILLIAMSPORT, June 22.—Apollo Woodward, Esq. formerly Associate Judge of Lycoming county, died yesterday at his residence, in this place, in the 81th year of his age. Judge Woodward came here, from New Jersey, more than half a century ago.

CARBONDALE, June 22.—The "strike" of the operatives in the mines of the Delaware and Hudson Canal Co. still continues, and it is said there has not been a ton of coal mined for the past three weeks.

Dr. Benjamin Bear, Jr., has located in Jersey Shore.

The Lecompton democrats in the Washington county district undertook to prevent the re-nomination of Hon. Wm. Montgomery for Congress. On a direct vote of the people, however, he received 1500 m. j. over the Lecompton candidate, Gen. Lazar.

Gov. Packer pardoned one Miller, a convicted robber, from Lycoming county, in the expectation that he would bear testimony against a counterfeiter to be tried this week at the U. S. District court in Williamsport. When wanted, however, it was found that he had cleared out with one "Kate King."

All the Philadelphia appointments made in March, 1857, were confirmed by the U. S. Senate, last week—fifteen months after they were commissioned and entered upon the duties of their office!

The indebtedness of Williamsport Borough is a little over \$15,000.

The Lancaster papers notice with much respect the fact of the retirement of William Murray from the lucrative and extensive Book business he had been so efficient in establishing.

The body of the son of E. B. Campbell, drowned near Jersey Shore, was found about two miles below the place he fell into on Pine creek.

It is said that Wm. Bigler and J. Glancy Jones have a whole regiment of Clerks at work in Washington, directing Lecompton documents under their frank to all parts of the State of Pennsylvania.

A little son of Mathew Tallman, of Muncy Creek township, aged about five years, was drowned in Muncy Creek, about a mile from the town, on Friday last. He had gone into the water alone to bathe, and getting beyond his depth was drowned before assistance arrived. His body was recovered.

The Directors of Girard College have determined to give preference to "whole orphans," and exclude those who have mothers living.

John P. Campbell, who was so inhumanly murdered in Kansas, a few days since, was formerly a resident of Indiana county, Pa.

Messrs. McKissick & Martin's men were making the track on the lower end of the Northern Central Railroad, after connecting with the upper end, on Wednesday last, paid our town a visit, accompanied by Messrs. McKissick & Martin.

Their arrival was announced by the firing of the cannon. The locomotive stopped at the lower end of town, when the men formed into line and marched through the streets with martial music. They stopped at several of our hotels, where the contractors furnished them with something to drink, a little stronger than water, when they started for home apparently in a very good humor.—*Saturday American*, June 19, 1858.

A boatman by the name of Harris, fell off his boat and was drowned at the Outlet Lock, near Nanticoke Dam, on Sunday week.

John E. Rupp, of York county, has been appointed State Agent by Gov. Packer on the Northern Central Railroad.

On Monday evening, Andrew Spitzer, of New Berlin, was engaged in swimming his horse in Penns Creek; the animal, being blind, made a mistep, and the rider slid from its back, leaving the horse to take its own course, when it steered into the "mighty deep" and was drowned.

On Wednesday week, Joel Fern, who was committed to Lancaster (Pa.) prison on Tuesday, for drunkenness, for thirty days, by Mayor Burrows, died in his cell at that place. He had traveled with another man from Philadelphia to Lancaster for the purpose of procuring work in a boiler shop, but on arriving he was seized with a fit of *delirium tremens*. He was buried in the almshouse burial ground.

MONTGOMERY WORKS.—The Danville Intelligencer says: "As our citizens generally understand it, the Montour Iron Company's property, at Danville, was sold at Sheriff's sale, for \$103—subject to the mortgages, which we have heard estimated at about \$600,000. Messrs. Michael Groves, Henry M. Fuller, E. H. Bally and Phillip Mills were the successful bidders."

A young man by the name of Bannell, while washing sheep in the Susquehanna river near Meshoppen, Wyoming county, in company with his father and brother, accidentally got into the stream where it was over his head, and being unable to swim, was drowned before they succeeded in rescuing him.

The body of a man was discovered lying in the river, on the upper side of Buyers' Island, about 1 1/2 miles below Sunbury on Saturday week, by some boys who were fishing along shore. He was probably from 21 to 25 years of age, and had dark hair. He had on when found, pants, a silk velvet vest, with the name of "R. K. Wells, Esq.," written on the lining in the back of the vest, a pair of low shoes, and 75 cents in money in his pockets. By his appearance he must have been in the water some 3 or 4 weeks. An inquest was held over him by Coroner S. B. Boyer, of Sunbury.
