Borough Ordinances.

THE attention of the citizens is called to the following Ordinances extracted from records of the Borough of Lewisburg, and NOTICE is hereby given by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Lewisburg, hat said Ordinances will hereafter be enforced to the letter against all persons offending against the same

Be it further enacted by the authority afore-said, That all nuisances such as dead horses, hered cattle, hogs, sheep, dogs, or any other kind or species of animals found on the streets or alleys of the borough, shall be immediately removed out of the bounds of the town by the owner or owners thereof; and any such nuisance as aforesaid having been killed by any person other than the owner, the person who has killed the animal shall forth with remove the same out

eugh. By the Ordinance of 12th June, 1829, a fine of from Five to Twenty Dollars is imposed for

obstructing water courses. The Ordinance of the 28th June,1845 makes it the duty of the holders of property to keep gutters open and in good repair at their own expense By the Ordinance of the 24th March, 1834,

all boxes, barrels, or hogsheads, on the pavements or sidewalks are to be removed by the High constable.

By the Ordinance of the 29th of May, 1848, if any person or persons shall after the publi-cation of this Ordinance obstruct any of the streets or alleys of said borough with manure or any other nuisance, such person or persons shall be subject to a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars for each and every offence; and further, all persons now having such obstructions or nuisances lying in the streets or alleys, are hereby required to remove the same on or before the 20th day of June, 1818.

By the Ordinance of the 5th of July, 1849, the High constable is directed to make a thoall other places in the borough where filth or nuisance of any description may exist, and give notice of the same to the persons on whose premises it is found to remove the same, or to cleause those places within one week from the time of such notice; and; if such notice is not complied with, the High constable shall proceed to remove any such nuisance at the expense of the person or persons on whose premises the same may be
