England is fast drifting to a republican form of government. Jews are admitted to Parliament, and the property qualification for membership is likely to be abrogated.

One hundred and fourteen Methodist ministers in New York, of the Black river conference, have petitioned Gov. Hicks to pardon Rev. Samuel Green, a local colored preacher now in the penitentiary of that state under a sentence of TEN YEARS imprisonment, for having in his possession a copy of Uncle Tom's Cabin.

Wm. M. Connelly, recently sent to jail at Cincinnati for concealing a fugitive slave, having served out his term of a few days, was met at the prison on his discharge on Friday by a procession of some 3,000 persons and a band of music, and escorted through the streets with much enthusiasm.

A RICH CONGREGATION.—The Mauch Chunk Gazette says the Moravian congregation at Bethlehem, Pa., have from five hundred thousand to one million dollars out at interest, and think that they should repair the old burying ground at Lehigh, which contains the ashes of Moravian Martyrs.
