Ordinance for Markets. SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Lew-isburg, and it is hereby ordained by the outho-SATURDAY mornings of every week shall be the Market Times for said Borough, when it may be lawful to sell and buy articles of produce for family use; and that MARKET STREET, from Second to Fourth Streets, shall be used for such sales-wagons &c. to occupy the sides of the pavements on the north side of the street from the first of October to the first of April, and the south side of the pave-

Secretos 2. Be it further ordained, That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, either the producers of marketing or their immediate agents, as bucksters or otherwise, to peddle or sell in any street or alley or in any part of the said Berough, any articles of produce for family use, other than at the times and places specified in the first section of this ordinance; and any person or persons violating this ordinance shall incur a penalty of from One Dollar to Five Dollars, to be recovered before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of Union county as like sums are recovered under the laws of Pennsulvania with costs, in the name of the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Lewisburg; one half of said penalty to be paid to the Overseer of the Poor of said Borough, and
