Freedom, national! Slavery, sectional!

Illinois is Republican!
Douglas is defeated on his own "Popular Sovereignty" Principle!

The Republicans of Illinois have elected their State Ticket—Miller for Treasurer, and Bateman for Superintendent of Public Instruction—by about **5,000 majority** over the regular Douglas ticket, and **2,000** over both the Douglas and Buchanan candidates for those offices! The majorities for Congress and Legislature also prove to be Republican. The People's Will is therefore *fairly expressed* in favor of An Lincoln, and against Douglas and also against Buchanan!

"How then is Douglas to succeed?" If he violates his own loudly declaimed principles, and accepts the Senatorship at the Lecompton Constitution was tried to be forced upon Kansas—against a clear vote of the People concerned—it will be by an unscrupulous use of power, Lecompton fashion. He will *strip* us, in defiance of the **MAJORITY PRINCIPLE**, by two means:

1. Quite a majority of Senators chosen two years ago are for Douglas, but were not chosen with reference to this issue, and do not on this question express their will who they nominally represent.

2. The State was Districted long time past. As the population now stands, 750 voters in *Egypt* (the lower, Democratic or Pro-Slavery section of the State) count as much in electing Congressmen and Legislators as 1000 voters in *Canaan* (as the upper, Republican, Anti-Slavery portion is called).

If with all these facts, Douglas and his friends will use their power to defy the popular will (as Buchanan sought to do in Kansas) by electing him, it will prove how flagrantly false they are to their own vaunted "principle." Such a *victory* will do no help in 1859. **MEANWHILE**, let all remember that *Illinois is Republican!*

Slifer and Gregg—State Treasurer.

We observe in an up-river paper a charge that Col. Slifer, after the nomination of Col. Gregg had been "fairly and honorably made, took decided ground against the election of the nominee"—

"was prominent in the abortive attempt to get another candidate"—"was compelled on election day to yield an apparent support"—and that "some of his neighbors assert even on that day he voted against the nominee." This is an amusing "comedy of errors,"—so full of falsehood, that in this *Senatorial District* it needs no denial. Supposing, however, that it may be designed to injure our cause at a distance, we think it no more than justice to brand the charge, as a whole and in detail, as *utterly untrue*, and we are curious to know what "neighbors" of Col. Slifer ever circulated that story!

Mr. Slifer was a Delegate to the Senatorial Convention, instructed for another man; but when Mr. Gregg received the majority of votes, Slifer moved and voted to make the nomination unanimous. That motion was *not* unanimous, and a dissatisfaction arose—from a cause we need not advert to, but not the fault of Slifer or Gregg—which threatened to make the election lost by default. Slifer, to our knowledge, did what he could to allay the excitement and bring about a reconciliation. He was solicited, from various influential quarters, to run himself, as an independent, and as a compromise candidate, but invariably refused. He was instrumental in getting up the second conference at Williamsport, by which means only the nomination was ratified, a general union was gained, and the election of Col. Gregg was secured. From that day until the polls closed at 7 o'clock on the evening of the election, Col. Slifer labored *openly* and *decidedly* for Gregg, at home and abroad, in sincerity and without abatement. No man in our county spent more time and money than he did, for the whole ticket, but especially for Gregg, who received a larger majority than our county ticket, in this county.

Col. Gregg himself, Hon. Andrew G. Curtin, Hon. John W. Killinger, five hundred persons in Lewisburg and Union county, as well as some of the best men of our party in Lycoming and Clinton, both supporters and opponents of Col. Gregg, can testify to Col. Slifer's solicitude and open and manly effort in making this—the first election in our Senatorial District—turn for the right side.

It is understood that the *aim* of this audacious misrepresentation of palpable truth is, to hinder Col. Slifer's promotion to the office of State Treasurer. Col. Slifer would soon see the use of any such means, by his friends, to injure any competitor. He is, and ever has been during our eleven years' knowledge of him, a true, faithful, party man. He has been solicited, by many prominent men of our party in various sections of the State, to be a candidate, and has consulted; but with his sense of the great responsibility of the office, his knowledge of its anxieties, care, and burdens, and the great trial required, it would not deprive him of an hour's sleep, or create an unpleasant thought against any honorable man—candidate, Senator, or Representative—if some other one is preferred. He makes no "claims"—urges no one—but, if elected, will (as he did before) guard the State's treasures as he would his own. Pennsylvania never had a more faithful Treasurer, or one who saved and gained her more money; and we believe (without any personal interest whatever, or undue partiality) she should and will again entrust to him that onerous but important station.
