There is a nett increase of \$80,754. All the increase is along the Northern and Eastern Districts. Whether the remaining Districts have really fallen away in wealth—or whether the apparent depreciation is the result of erroneous estimates—is for the consideration and determination of the Commissioners. We should not suppose there was so much real difference in the comparative prosperity of the Districts.

Our Side-Walks. For the safety of all who have occasion to walk the streets of our town, it is always necessary that the side-walks should be kept in good order, and as far as possible, free from all kinds of obstructions. But, at no time is it more necessary than when evening merriness, both religious and secular, are multiplied on every hand; and when glasses have occasion to be used in the walks.

Improving. Mr. Foss has presented as some of the new cents, which the U. S. Mint has coined to supply the place of the recent "mullatto nickel"—the new design had without the "Liberty." The new cent is of the same size as the sham Democratic one so mangled by Judge Kelley—but of a darker color, and instead of the buzzard has the head of a "native American" with the Republican word "Liberty" on his or her cap. On the whole, it is an improved coin, but yet too bulky, and its color is still too much of a compromise between silver and gold.

The materials of the Home Gazette establishment, late of this place, were sold on Wednesday to the publishers of the Bellefonte Press, for \$125. The Gazette was a neatly printed and ably conducted paper—perhaps no one in the county ever had more labor and means bestowed upon it—but it was not needed, and has shared the fate of half a score of others in the county within our knowledge. The truth is, two papers in Union county are sufficient for its real wants, and more can not win a fair, honorable, wholesome livelihood. Unnecessary Journals benefit no one; while the losses they incur, are felt by various classes in community, and make a fearful aggregate.

An interesting trial was decided at Sunbury, on Wednesday, which consumed a good deal of time. The dispute was about a few feet of land, upon which, it was alleged, the Supervisors of Jordan township located a road the full width as required by law. The prosecutor (a widow lady) contended that more than half the road was upon her land, and brought suit against the Supervisors for trespass. The amount in dispute was but a few dollars, but it has been in court several times, and the costs, it is stated, have run up to upwards of a \$1,000. About seventy witnesses were examined, and the jury was out some thirty hours, and then brought in a verdict in favor of the Supervisors.—Miltonian.

BURNED TO DEATH—A child of three or four years old, belonging to Reid Neidig, several miles above town, was so badly burned by its clothes taking fire, on Wednesday last, that it died before a physician could be called in.—Sunbury Amer.

SHOCKING DEATH.—A man named Wm. Kissinger, a brick maker of this city, aged about 85 years, met with a shocking death on Wednesday night. It seems that while under the influence of liquor he laid down on the top of Messrs. Frees & Kissinger's lime-kiln, in Canal street, below Penn. Next morning his body was found almost burned to a crisp, presenting a horrible sight, rendered still more shocking by a whiskey bottle protruding from his pocket, and another at his side, nearly emptied of its contents. The probability is that the unfortunate man was suffocated by the gas soon after lying down, and died long before the fire reached him; his death is of course attributed to rum, the great destroyer of the human race.—Reading Journal.

An intense agitation was created in Tunkhannock by the abduction of a girl of that place, aged 13 years, named Catharine Langdon, to a kind of convent in Susquehanna county. Her father got wind of her place of abode, and by a little stratagem and by a little force, rescued her from her new home.
