Isaacs.—In the State Treasurer's Report for 1858, there is a payment to A. Kieckner, Treasurer of the Sugar Valley & White Deer Turnpike, of \$2,000, balance of subscription of stock, per act 12th April, 1858.

We have been under the impression that this last payment of the State Funds was to have been settled and the road was thoroughly worked through. We are also informed that that part of the road in the upper end of Union county—in Hartley, Lewis, and perhaps part of West Buffalo—has not been worked. All the money, it is feared has been expended either above or below that central section, and the sections are thus wronged.

The Commissioners have appointed Daniel Bruckmiller, of Sunbury, Mercantile Appraiser of Northumberland County for the year 1859.
