HOW MUCH SNUFF WE TAKE -An as tonishing amount of snuff and tobacco is consumed in the United States, but while the pernicious habit of chewing seems to be on the increase, the lovers of healthy reform will be glad to learn that the practice of small-taking is thought to be on the decline. The Lorillard manufactory is the largest one in the world, and pays more internal revenue tax to the government than a score of other shops combined. That the reader may gain some idea of the vast extent of their business we append a few figures. At the present time their tax is about one hundred thousand dollars a month, or more than one million of dollars a year. Their printing bill CREAT BARGAINS for labels &c., amount to over one thousand dollars a month. The average amount of ttock on hand for six years reaches the enormous figure of one million three hundred thousand pounds. The amount of stock on hand for the year just past, 1866, reached three millions of pounds. In 1860 over one million pounds of snuff alone were packed by this house, no less than forty-one thoueand eight hundred and seventy-five stone QUEENSWARE. jars, averaging four, eight, fifteen, and twen- Boots and Shoes, Eats, Caps ty-five pounds each being turned out, beside three millions of bottles full of snuff.

PLANTING VEGETABLE SEED, -Most of the books and papers recommend planting Lima beans with the eye down, but I have had enough of that system. Last year I planted part eyes down, and part I threw in any way. Those I planted with eyes down came up two days later, and where not half as vigorous or productive. A good support is made by planting sunflowers amongst them at the same time. Break off the lower leaves as fast as they grow, leaving but a few at the top, or they will shade the beans too much. The sunflower seed are also valuable as a food for poultry.

As to planting Carrots, I roak the reed 24 hours in lukewarm rain water, drain off the water and stir in plaster until they reptrate. I prefer plaster to sand (as recommended by your correspondent, R. L., in Pebruary number, on many accounts. The Belgian sorts yield more and pull easier than the Orange, but are not as good to feed milk cows. I soak Beet seed 48 hours, then mix white plaster same as carrot seed. When planting Squashes, Melons and Cucumbers. I dig a hole and place therein from a peck to a half bushel of hog manure. Cauliflower and Cabbages head earlier and form larger heads on hills like this .- Hammonton

DESTROY WEEDS .- Many farmers are in the habit of throwing all the weeds they coilect about their farms on to the dunghills. This is an excellent and economical practice, provided they are out before they have gone to seed. But, unfortunately, weed cutting and gathering is rarely done while the weeds are green, and as a consequence, the next season, their pestiverous seeds are scattered broadcast over the farm with the manure, and, as is to be expected, a harvest of weeds and a heavy outlay of labor is the result. Never throw a woed which has riponed its seeds upon the dang-

It is enough to carry off a eron of grass, too often, without making any return in the way of top-dressing, even on land laid down as a hungry waste, without stripping the land of the falling blades in autumn; or the young shoots in spring .-This system of exhaustion can lead only to sterility and poverty.


