AGRICULTURAL.

GREASING WAGONS. - But few peop re aware that they do wagons and carriages more injury by greasing to plentifully than by any other way. A well made wheel will endure common wear from ten to twentyfive years, if care is taken to use the right kind and proper amount of grease; but if this is not attended to, they will be used up in five or six years. Lard should never be used on a wagon, for it will penetrate the hub and work its way out around the tenons of the spokes and spoil the wheel. Tallow is the best lubricator for wood axletress, and castor oil for iron.

Just enough grease should be applied to the spindle of the wagon to give it a light coating; this is better than more, for the surplus put on will work out at the ends, and be forced by the shoulder-bands and nut washers into the hub around the outside of the boxes.

To oil an axletree, first wipe the spindle clan with a cloth wet with spirits of turpentine, and then apply a few drops of custor oil near the shoulder and end. One teaspoonful is sufficient for the whole .- Ohio

EARLY TOMATOES. To have tomatoes early, plant a few seeds, any timethis month, in the pots in which the plants are growing in the kitchen window. They will so germinate and grow very rapidly, and when the plants are to or three inches high set, one of each in boxes three inches square, or very small flower pots, and give them the same attention the house plant receive. As soon as all danger from frost is over, transfer the tomato plants which will then be budded, and perhaps covered with miniature fruit, to the smooth side of a high fence or sunny side of a building, futo not over rich soil, and you will have ripe tomatoes on the fourth of July, if past experience and a favorable season are worth any thing. Try it.

ASH RECEPTACLES. - Anthony M. Carson, Clark Co., Ohio, writes to the Agriculturist describing an ash receptacle called "Hall's Ash House," which appears to consist of a hopper with a sive at the bottom, forming the top of the iron-lined, wooden ash-helder, which may be used as a leach tub as well. When the ashes are leached, by undoing four hooks the box may be taken off from the ashes and set up again. The idea seems to be a good one, and such an ash receptacle would not be difficult of construction. Mr. Hall may have a patent for it, but if he does not enable the public to buy it, he must risk people making use of his ideas.
