Insects on Fruit Trees. Insects will begin their work as soon as there is any young growth to work on and if not checked continue it to the injury of the trees. Don't stop to wait on us, to ask what shall be done, but kill the insects when first discovered, by some means. We have written in these past years enough about the tent caterpillar to fill a small volume. We have shown its eggs, and set forth the importance of removing these. Where this has been thoroughly done, there will be but little trouble, Where it has been neglected, they will not "fold up their tents like the Arabs," but just keep spreading them all the time. Wherever a nest or tent is seen, no matter how small-and they are very conspicuous when the dew is on them in the morning-do not rest until the nest is destroved. Bend down the limb, climb the tree, get a step ladder, or in some way reach the nest, and pull it out and crush the young brood. Some use swabs charged with soft soap, petroleum, or other substances. These will do if faithfully applied, but to our notion there is nothing as sure as pulling the nest off by hand, and putting it under foot. The squeamish may wear gloves.

Borers are to be probed or cut out. We havn't much faith in squirting any preparation into their holes. Circulio will now begin its work, and must

be met at once. Avoid all vaunted remedies and washes, but follow the only sure plan yet known-jaring the trees, catching the insect on a large cloth, and killing it.

The whole grub will often make sad havoc among seedlings and young nursery stock. When a young tree in the orehard wilts, dig down and find the borer and kill him. Lice or aphides will appear on the young growth. If the trees are small bend down the ends of the invested twigs, and immerse them in tobacco water or quassia water. - Agricul-

Plowing.—An item of importance in blowing is to see, before beginning, if there is any defect in the surface of the ground that can be modified or corrected. In the commonly adopted course of plowing round and round, we produce a rise on the outer edge, and a depression in the centre, which in manp cases lays the foundation of a ruinous "wash" and in pieces of fine level land we see deep depressions created that hold the surface water, making a "mire" that drowns out the seed sown there,-Starting in the centre and plowing "back furrows," is an ample and simple remedy for this, which from mere thoughtlessness is seldom done. In finishing off the field, leave a strip on the sides equal to the width of the turn rows or "headlands," and plow round the entire field. It will then have a clean, neat finished appearance.

Some shoulders in working horses may be effectually prevented by cutting a piece of leather into a shape so as to lie snugly between the shoulders of the horse and the collar. This sends off all the friction, as the collar slips and moves on the leather and not on the shoulders of the horse. Chafin is caused by friction; hence, this remedy is a plausible one, and is much better than tying a slip of leather under the collar.

WEEVIL IN BARNS. - There are many barns so infested with weevil, that their owners stack their grain for one or two years to get rid of them. It is said that if the barns be thoroughly cleaused and the joice and timbers well swept, and fresh lime be slacked and sprinkled plentifully around, the weevil will all be destroyed.

LEMON SHERBET. - Dissolve a pound and a half of loaf sugar in a quart of water, add the juice of ten lemons, pross the lemons so as to extract not only the juice, but the oil of the rind, and let the skins remain awhile in the water and sugar; strain through a sieve, and then freeze it like ice cream.

PLANT small trees. They cost one half less at the nursery, less in transportation and in planting you will lose scarcely none at all. You can form the tops to suit yourself. Form the heads as you please, which. on prairies, is absolutely necessary to suc-

POTATO CUSTARD. - Ten potatoes boiled soft, six or eight eggs, sugar to your taste, one cup milk, quarter pound of butter, nutmeg, essence of lemon, brandy and wine to your taste. Mash the potatoes very fine.

Choose perfect eggs for breeding purposes. Let your hands be free from grease while handling eggs to be set. An egg besmeared with yolk will not hatch.
