NEW PRIMARY ELECTION LAW

The uniform primary election law passed by the legislature is now up to the governor for signature. The opponents of the new measure claim it is unconstitutional because the bill carries two subjects, elections and a liquor clause; that the latter is not mentioned in the title and that its provisions permitting boroughs and townships to hold elections other than those specified in the bill is special legislation.

Under the new law all political parties will hold their primary election at the same time and same place. Each party will have a separate ticket on which will be the name of the candidates. Those getting the highest vote will be placed on the ticket, and the electors will thus vote twice for their favored candidate—once at the primary and then again at the general election.
