All the Pacific States—California, Oregon, and Colorado, have gone for Lincoln and Johnson; they have no idea of seceding from the old Union.

Hon. Smith Fuller, Union candidate for Congress in the Westmoreland district, has one vote tallied in him in the return from Co. G, 4th Pa. Cav., before Petersburg, made to the Prothonotary of this county. On the tally list, we notice the name of Philipps Walter, of Westmoreland county. This is the only name on the list from that district, and is therefore in all probability, the one who cast the Putin vote. Even one vote is sometimes useful, and as Fuiton will contest Dawson's seat (should he get the certificate of election,) we deem it proper to mention this fact.

In today's paper, will be found in tabular form, the result of the election, excepting Marion top, which was not reported. As the matter now stands, Lincoln's majority is 241. Marion was reported to have gone 54 majority for "Little Mac," which, if counted, would leave Lincoln's majority on home vote, 187. Some think that Marion will yet report, but under the ruling of the Convention at the special election, when Buffalo was left out, we cannot see how it can be received, and we were then told that their chief object was to establish a sound precedent—this case too, is much stronger than the former; of course it can not come in.

The following was furnished us for publication sometime ago, but in political excitement, overlooked: George Beighle, fell at the battle of Kenesaw Mountain, June 27th 1864. He was struck by a minnie ball, through or near the heart.

He was born near Middle Lancaster, Butler county Pa., September 18th, 1832; baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Church. But having emigrated to Kentucky, and then to Illinois, and being beyond the reach of his own church, he became a communicant in the Methodist Church. He had been nearly two years in the service of his country as a volunteer, when he fell gallantly fighting in her defense.

George Neely, also at the vicinity of Middle Lancaster, died at Fort Delaware, on Sunday morning, the 25th of Sept., 1864. The deceased had volunteered, and was stationed at the above fort when he died, after a few days illness. He was born December 6th, 1829. He was a member in good standing in the English Lutheran Church of Middle Lancaster. His remains were brought home and interred in the grave yard of the above church. His funeral was attended by a large number of friends and neighbors.
