Putting Down Butter.

There is no peculiar art or mystery about putting down butter for winter use, so that it will keep sweet, sound and good a very long time.

The last time we went around Cape Horn, we bought in Baltimore a few days before sailing two tubs of ordinary Western butter for cabin stores.

The butter had been correctly made and put down in sweet, new red oak tubs, holding about eighty pounds each, in this manner:

A great deal of the celebrated Orange county or Goshen butter is not nearly up to its reputation on account of being packed in one solid mass from bottom to top, or in layers of from three to five inches in thickness.

Of all the woods used for butter tubs or kegs, the red beech, common in several of the northern counties of Pennsylvania and in many parts of New York, is the best.

Of course the very best receptacle to put down butter in for long keeping is a strong, well glazed stone jar, with a close-fitting cover.

Fattening Hogs. The editor of the Germantown Telegraph having made inquiries of a farmer as to the profitability of pork raising and the best way to feed hogs, received a reply, the substance of which was:

1st. That feeding grain, especially corn, to hogs will pay better than would the same amount fed to any other kind of farm stock.

2d. One bushel of good shelled corn, made into meal and fed to the hogs regularly, in such quantity as to prevent them from fretting for more, will produce from five to seven pounds of pork during the months of October and November.

3d. An important point is to keep the hogs growing all the time—not starving them to mere hog frames, during the summer, and then attempting to finish off quickly on the arrival of cold weather.

4th. When put up in the fall—indeed during the entire season—a comfortable shelter should be provided so that the hogs may avail themselves of it whenever a storm occurs, but when the autumn storms commence the hogs should be penned for good till ready for slaughter.

5th. With the pure "Chester White" stock of hogs, properly bred forward during the spring and summer months, it is safe to feed eighty-five cent corn on a basis of five cents per pound for the animal feed.
