or naturalized in the United States, and
subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are
citizens of the United States, and of the
State wherein they reside. No State shall
make or onforce any law which shall

any State deprive any person of life, his
erty, or property without due process of
law, nor deny to any person within its
jurisdiction the equal protection of the
law.

Representatives shall be apportioned among the several States according to their respective numbers, counting the whole number of persons in each State; excluding Indians not taxed; but whenever the right to vote at any election for electors of President and Vice President, or for United States Representatives in Congress, executive and judicial officers, or the members of the Legislature thereof, is denied to any of the mate inhabitants of such State, being wenty-one years of age, and citizens of the United States, or in any way abridged, except for participation in rebellion or other critac, the basis of representation therein shall be reduced in the proportion which the number of uch male citizens twenty one years of age in the law.
