Butler County Sabbath School Convention.—Order of Exercises.—May 7th & 8th.

TUESDAY FORENOON.

10:00—10:15: Opening exercises. 10:15—10:35: Address of Welcome—Rev. Dr. Young. 10:35—11:00: Organization, appointing committees, etc. 11:00—12 m.: Brief address—What have we done in the Sabbath School of our county, what have we still to do, and how shall we do it? (A report on this topic will be given by a committee appointed for that purpose.)

TUESDAY AFTERNOON.

2:00—2:20: Devotional exercises. Prayer for our teachers. 2:20—3:00: "Modern Improvements in Sabbath Schools," with drill exercises in opening and closing them. 3:00—3:15: Questions: 1st, How do you prepare for teaching? 2d, When and how do you make personal application of the truth? (Brief written answers are requested from the audience.) 3:15—5:00: The Model Sabbath School. (The Institute will be divided into classes, each with a teacher, and go over the lesson Mark vii, 31—37, the same as in Sabbath School. Followed by a report from each teacher on his plan of the lesson, and the applications made.) Criticism and discussion. Address on "methods of managing Bible lessons and the principles of teaching."

WEDNESDAY FORENOON.

9:00—9:20: Devotional exercises. 9:20—9:35: The teacher with the Bible and in the class. 9:35—10:20: The Institute will be divided into three divisions, 1st, Pastors, 2d, Lady teachers, 3d, Gentlemen teachers. Each division will have a chairman, and consider practical questions. 10:20—11:00: Reports from each division upon the subjects considered, followed by discussion. 11:00—11:35: Sacred Geography and the blackboard. 11:35—12 m.: The model teachers' meeting.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON.

2:00—2:10: Devotional exercises. Prayer for the "little children and their instructors." 2:10—3:20: The model infant school. 3:20—3:30: Blackboard; object and picture teaching. 3:30—4:00: Questions: 1st, What training do our Sabbath school teachers need for their work? 2d, How shall this training be secured? (Brief written answers as before.)

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

7:00—7:30: Reports of committees and closing business. 7:30—9:00: General meeting of Sabbath Schools, with address to children.
