This concrete should be made of washed gravel and hydraulic ce-Common mortar mixed with nent. pounded brick and washed gravel, makes a concrete for floors nearly as good as that formed with hydraulic cement. Such floors; become very hard, and are much cheaper than those of brick or flag stones.

A CASE OF ILLNESS - A man was taken suddenly ill a short time ago, and the only cause he could suggest was some elder wine he had been drinking. The wine was ex-amined, and was found to contain large quantities of zinc, having been boiled in an iron boiler that had been "galvanized" or sinced. All persons should be cautious not to place any substance containing an acid in any zinc vessel, as it will dissolve, and it is extremely pernicious.

GOOD FRITTERS .- To a pint of good buttermilk, add a little salt and a teaspoonful of soda; stir in flour enough to make a thick atter. Fry in hot lard.


