At the annual meeting of the stockholders of the S. & E. Railroad, in Philadelphia on Monday, the old Board of Directors was re-elected, with the exception of Mr. Wilcox, of Elk, whose place is supplied by Jos. M. Brannan, Esq., of this city.

There is no place in our chain of Lakes that confers so many advantages as a manufacturing point as Erie. Why then do not more of our people turn their attention to this source of wealth? The question is not easy to answer. We see about us all the elements for the profitable manufacture of almost every kind of goods—glass, iron, shoes, nails, agricultural implements, wooden ware, edge tools—in short every thing that Yankee ingenuity can invent, can be manufactured here cheaper than amid the bleak hills of New England, and in the crowded and over populated region round about Philadelphia. With one line of communication to the coal fields, and two more with arms reaching out to the same points, there will be no lack of fuel to drive machinery. The Lake Superior region will furnish us iron and copper as cheap as any other city on the Lakes—with communication by Lake, by Canal, and by Rail in every direction—surely there is no field that possesses so many advantages as this for the investment of capital in the direction indicated. Why cannot shoes be made as cheap here as in Massachusetts? Why not glass as cheap in Philadelphia? Why not wooden ware, brooms, nails, window glass, candy, and every thing else our merchants buy from eastern manufacturers? They can. It only requires the will, and a liberal encouragement on the part of our citizens, to draw the necessary operatives and capitalists to our midst, and thus to build up a manufacturing city second to none in the country.

SPIRITUALISM TO SOME PURPOSE.—The West field Republican tells of a gentleman of that village who has long been a believer in Spiritualism, and had it impressed upon his mind recently, by some friendly spirit, that riches were in store for him in the oil regions of Pennsylvania; that a certain sleeping medium, or clairvoyant doctor, who has also resided here for a short time, would be used as the instrument, by disembodied existences, to indicate the locality, in the vicinity of Titusville, where was an abundant inexhaustible supply of oil.
