The Connant Reporter records a sad accident on the Cleveland and Erie road on the night of the 4th. It says on that night the engineer on the freight train going east, on his arrival at that station, discovered evidence that this train had passed over the body of some person, and that a man's foot was hanging to the cow catcher. Also were immediate dispatches sent west in search and near the crossing, three miles east of Kingsville, the remains of a human body was found terribly mutilated, where were afterwards identified as those of James O. Hinkle, son of J. D. C. Hinkle, and resident about six miles east of the accident.

Young Hinkle had been to Cleveland on Wednesday to spend the Fourth, and on his return home got off the Accommodation train at Kingsville station. A young man who accompanied him says that after tarrying an hour or so in the vicinity of the Railroad station, the two started together down the track, the boy striding first at his home, after a walk of a mile and a half when he hid Hinkle good night. Hinkle remarking that he was sleepy, but thought he could walk in the center of the track without difficulty. About a mile and a half from where Hinkle and the boy separated, are the first traces of the accident, and it is quite clear that, having been up the night previous, he sat down on the cattle guard to rest, with his feet hanging over the excavation, and there went to sleep. The freight train west passed that point about half past ten o'clock, and must have struck him while in a sitting position, carrying the body several rods west, where it was passed by the night Express, and where the freight train afterwards came in contact with the body.

Perrine's Torpedo.—Tinsville, famous as the center of the oil excitement, was visited by a very destructive tornado on the evening of the 4th. It commenced at about 7 P. M., and laid waste everything in its course. The loss of property is estimated at \$10,000. Thirty buildings were damaged to a greater or less extent. Trees were torn up and carried long distances, and scarce a sign remains of the out-buildings and fences which were in the direction of the storm. Several land areas and pits broken, besides being injured by the wind, two or three received internal injuries. All it is hoped will recover. Those who were caught in the tempest were violently seized and hurled about in various directions—some against buildings, trees and fences, and many were tossed from place to place until quite senseless. Some were injured by tree-top, boards, roofs of houses, and pieces of timber which flew in all directions. Several buildings were lifted from their foundations and carried a considerable distance. The greater number of the damaged buildings were unoccupied, among which was the dwelling of Mr. George Brewer, a two-story house, elegantly furnished, which now lies a mass of ruins. One horse was killed, and one had a leg broken. The tornado passed through the village in a southeasterly direction, and seemed to spend its fury in a timber lot near the Harborside oil well. Duffy & Co. will land passengers, after a good night's rest on packet, at New Brighton, connecting with the train run expressly for that connection by the P. F. W. & C. R. Co., and thus arrive at Pittsburgh at 8, 30 A. M.—G. Ward Republican.

RAILROADS ALMOST ANNIHILATING SPACE.—A traveler by rail, between New York City and New Orleans, writes that he took breakfast at Rochester, N. Y., dinner at Erie, Penn., and supper at Cleveland, Ohio; then breakfast the next morning at Seymour, Ind., dinner at Olney, Ill., and breakfast the next morning at Columbus, Ky., being only one meal in each of those large States as he swept through them, having left Chambers street at five P. M. one day, and arrived in Cleveland at twenty minutes past five P. M. the next; making the whole distance traveled, six hundred and forty-one miles, in twenty-four hours and twenty minutes, and passing through the States of New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Kentucky.

A military Court of Inquiry, convened by order of Adj. Gen. Wilson, to inquire into the facts of the contested Brigadier Generalship of the 20th Division of the Pennsylvania volunteers, met at the Army of the Wayne Guards, in this city, on Tuesday. The Court was composed of Maj. Gen. Wm. H. Keim, 5th Div. P. V., Maj. Gen. George Hay, 4th Div. P. V., and Col. L. S. Cantwell, 1st Reg. 2d Brig. 18th Div. P. V. The contestants were Gen. J. K. St. Clair, of Crawford, who had received and held the commission of Maj. General of the division; and Gen. M. Schlaudaker, of this city, who contested his right to the commission. Benj. Grant, Esq., appeared for Gen. St. Clair, and J. Ross Thompson, Esq., for Gen. Schlaudaker. The following is the decision in the case:

"Having maturely considered the evidence, the Board of Officers decided that a number of the votes cast was illegal, and therefore rejected, and that from the testimony Mathias Schlaudaker received the highest number of the lawful votes polled; and was duly elected Major General of the 20th Division P. V. and that J. K. St. Clair is not entitled to his commission."
