St. VALENTINE'S DAY .- The custom of sending valentines, so much in vogue now, is one of very ancient origin. It was very common in England as early as the fifteenth century. It did not originate in that country however, but was copied by the laity from the clergy in the days of Catholicism. The oustom is traced back by many authors for more. than 1,000 years, and there is but little doubt that it is even older than this. Like many others so popular to-day, it seems to be but an analogy of an old Pagan observance.

The origin of St. Valentine's day seems to be wrapped in mystery, little being known of the good saint, notwithstanding his festival is one of the most popular in the calendar. THE DRAFT. -Our citizens should bear the fact in mind that the draft will take place on the 10th of March, and that no enlistments on the present call are to be credited after the 1st of the month, when all Government bounties cease. The city has yet to furnish 18 men from the East Ward, and some 40 from the West Ward, in order to fill her quote, and if not provided by the period specified they will be drafted.
