The dredging of the channel will be resumed in a short time, and continued until sufficient depth of water has been obtained to admit any sized vessel that now sails on the lakes.

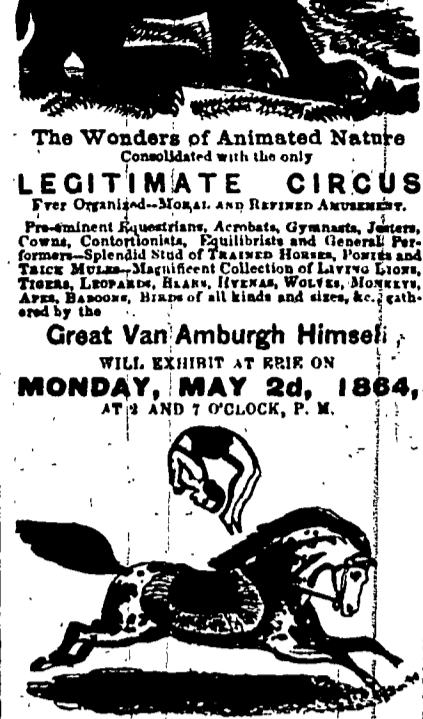

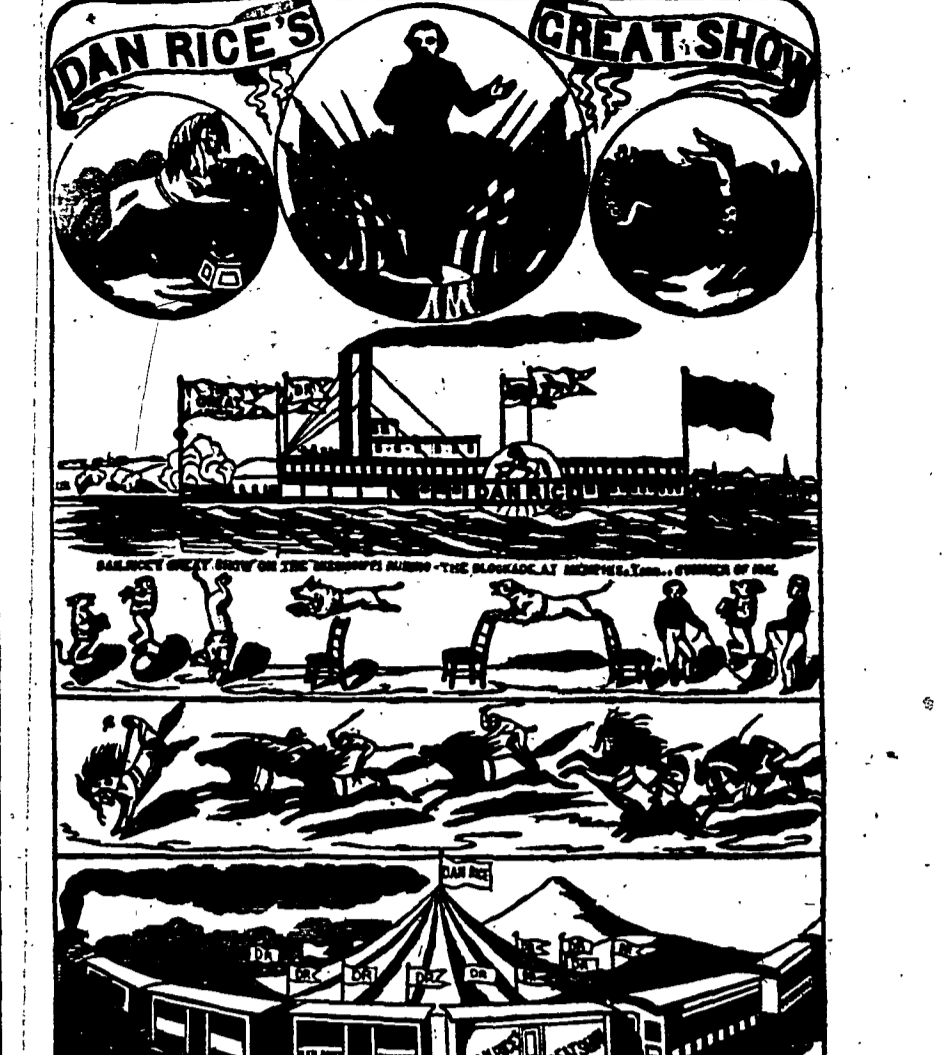

NEWS OF THE WEEK.

A dispatch from the 17th from Cairo, says that the steamer Mina was fired into on Tuesday night, near Fort Pillow, by fifty rebels in Union uniform.

The report of the Commissary General of Prisoners accompanying the Secretary of War, in his report on the 23rd inst., shows that the number of Rebel officers and men captured by us since the beginning of the war is: 1 Lieutenant-general, 5 major-generals, 25 brigadier-generals, 180 colonels, 146 lieutenant-colonels, 244 majors, 2,497 captains, 5,311 lieutenants, 10,363 non-commissioned officers, 23,000 privates, and 15,800 privates.
