exhibition. We carried not but hastened
to Cincinnati. How fine the whole
country is. What elegant farms, fine
buildings and monstrous fields of corn;
and Cincinnati itself, what an energetic
city! How great its enterprise—how vast
its business. We did not stop but passed
on to Covington. How much more com-
plicit the passage of the river when the
new bridge will be completed. The mon-
strous piers on either shore, in imagina-
tion stretching out their arms to link clo-
se the destinies of the two cities. Covin-
ton is a fine town. Its lumber business is
immense, and among its inhabitants I
found many whom in my school-boy days
I had known further North. We found rest for the night with
"mine host" of the "Elliott House." A
very fine house, with which no complaint
can reasonably be made if they will only
supply the rooms more abundantly with
water and towels. The table, attendants,
rooms and beds are very excellent.
From Covington you reach Lexington
by the Kentucky Central R. R.—not in
very good condition. Bragg, Kirby Smith
and Morgan have too often paid it their
respects, and I do not think it has profited
by their attention, and only during last
week the bridge near Cynthia was re-
moved by the freshet, and it is but just
now in running order. The road master,
Mr. Reynolds, formerly of the Buffalo &
Erie, is giving it every attention, and will
keep it in order if the "robs" don't inter-
fere. Cynthia and Paris are fine towns
and present some evidence of progress.—
At the former place John Morgan did
considerable damage to his rail road and
burned quite a large number of good
buildings. Here is where Gen. Burbridge
caught him and inflicted such severe pun-
ishment that he was glad to hasten his
departure.
Lexington seems to be situated in a very
garden; nothing can be conceived finer
than the surrounding country. The city
itself has scarcely progressed in twenty
years. There is, however, about it many
objects of interest. On the Cemetery
hill, among the monuments of lesser im-
portance, towers the high shaft to the
memory of the Sage of Ashland—his
whose voice had stilled the storm of 1822,
and whose statesmanship had greatly as-
sisted in conducting the country to its
elevated position, and the silver-tones of
whose voice and the magic weaving of
whose hand had quieted the storm of 1852.
But alas! age crept on apace. "To all liv-
ing it is given once to die." The high
position he occupied in the councils of his
country—nor the place he filled in the
hearts of his countrymen could stay the
life destroyer, and after leaving us the ex-
ample of a bright, well spent and patri-
otic life, during which time he gave advice
and steady arm had so often swayed and
guided the councils of the nation, amidst
the tears and mourning of the people he
rested with his fathers. A great and good
man had died, and it was right that a
nation that had profited so much by his
councils should mourn his departure. And
O! that the nation had continued to be
guided by his sage advice. Then this de-
vastating war would not have spread over
the country. Then would the waste in the
land not have been heard. Then would
peace and prosperity have been the twin
rewards of virtue and patriotism.
At Lexington terminated our railroad
travel. From there by stage, private con-
veyance or the primitive method of horse-
back travel. The Lexington Pike, over
which we traveled for some distance, is
very fine, and passes through the best
tilled part of Kentucky, and the soil re-
sponds favorably to the tillage. The crops
cannot be excellent. The cattle are raised
in great numbers. Negroes are fat and do
not seem to take upon them the respon-
sibility of the war, and our driver—ap-
parently an intelligent mulatto of 25 years—
said he had not the least idea what the
war was for; that he had not heard of
the white folks say what it was, nor did he
even hear an explanation from the old
woman in relation to it, but he "reckoned"
both parties were mad. There was skir-
mishing all along the pike, from Kingston
to Lexington, 32 miles. There was a fight
of several hours duration at Richmond.—
Our boys stood well, but Kirby Smith had
more thousands than we had hundreds
and, of course, we had to fall back. I ob-
served several six pound shot holes thro'
a brick church about six miles south of
Richmond, where I was informed a skir-
mish had taken place. During this expedi-
tion the Union citizens left or secreted
themselves in the mountains, leaving their
women and children at home. They were
not molested but treated with the greatest
respect. This I am informed by the ex-
cellent lady of the minister who denies
himself the comforts of a life in the out-
world because he thinks that among
this poor benighted people, at the base of
the mountains, he can do more good to
his fellow man. I am now stopping with
him, and a more genial, pleasant man, I
apparently true and earnest christian, I
think I never met. He is man of much
more than ordinary talents. His wife is a
woman of much intelligence and refine-
ment, with children whose education, liter-
ary and social, has not been neglected.
He is an anti-slavery man, but such an one
as all must respect, no matter how much
you might differ from him in principle.—
He believes the institution to be wrong
and for ten long years he has been settled
in the State of Kentucky telling the slave-
holders themselves of what he believes to
be their great sin, and begging them to
turn from the error of their ways. This is
legitimate. This is far different from the
holy tirade of slavery that we hear of the
North that preaches to the fanatic of
Massachusetts to convert the sinners of
Georgia. He has a small church and a
school. The fall term had just commenced
with 73 scholars. They expected a teacher,
but he has been in the army (100 days
men) and has returned home sick, and in

the meantime the minister and his grown
up daughter, assisted by a younger son
are carrying on the school. They are la-
boring to do good and God grant that
they may be blessed. In the meantime,
if any of our people wish, to contribute
money where it will do good, where it is
needed and where it will be faithfully ap-
plied to the instructing of both white and
black, let them remit to Rev. John A.
Fee, Berea, Madison Co., Ky.
About politics nothing is said. In Ken-
tucky no man can do business without a
permit from the government, and no man
who is not loyal can get a permit, and the
official granting permits judges of loyalty
by the standard he sets up himself, hence
it is easy to determine why all the business
men in the cities are so intensely loyal to
A. Lincoln personally, and refrain from
expressing and opinion adverse to his po-
litical success. The other morning at Cor-
vington my companions had got, one a
Commercial the other a Gazette at 5 cents
each, and I thought it advisable to mix
things a little, so I asked the boy for an
Enquirer, and he from the bottom of his
package drew the paper and whispered 10
cents. I thought it cheap enough. I did
not inquire the reason of the difference in
price but suppose it is owing to its own in-
trinsic value. I think it was the first num-
ber I ever saw and I read it carefully and
could discover nothing in it that was not
just as loyal as the Erie Gazette and that I
suppose to be sound; hence I think I was
not damaged by my indiscretion in pur-
chasing the paper.

A McClellan Excursion.—J. M. Clarke,
of Boone, a man of some prominence in
that vicinity and hitherto a Republican,
