From the Ganine o berty, Fayette Co.] John W. Geary, the candidate of the Radical Abolitionists for Governor of Pennsylvania, was elected Lieut manit Colonel of the 2nd, Pa., regiment of Volunteers in the war with Mexico, upon the organization of that regiment in the city of Pittsturgh. Wm. II. Roberts, of this County, was Colonel com-mending, and died in the city of Mexico. After his death, Geary was fromoted to the Colonelog. The Fayette County Voluntees were attached to this regiment and known's ('o. II. They distinguished themselves for gallant conduct and intrepid biavery, in all the important engagements from Vera Cruz to the City of Mexico, including the bloody as aults upon that city. They centinued in service until the end of the war, and were honorably di-charged. The survivors, upon their return, were received with woll earned and highly distinguished honors by their fel' low-citizens. Here at the county seat, they were honored by a splendid reception, participated in by citizens of the county generally, as well as by the ladies, who greeled their return with all that delicate attention and re fined taste peculiar to their sex. At Connels. ville, also, they were the recipients of a handsome oration, the heart-felt tribute of the contigens and ladies of that place and vicinity. The reception at Connellsville took place in Saturday, July 15th, 1848. The reception peech was made by Dr. James C. Cummings, and the response by sergeant Peter A. Johns. After the delivery of the speeches, and participing of the peech start of the peech of the taking of an elegant dinner prepared for the occasion, the returned soldiers met logether and unanimously adopted a preamble and series of resolutions, which show up the character of John W. Geary in such a light as would reader his election as Governor an everlasting-disgrace to the State of Pennsyl-These resolutions were unanimously adop-

ted by true and tried soldiers, by men who knew Geary well, and by men who did not hesitate to proclaim their estimate of his character, and that too not in tender. dainty seniences, but in well expressed and forcible anguage. The festimony of these proceedings gains additional force from the fact that it was uttered at such a time and under such circumstances, as to exempt it entirely from any imputation of political influences. The proceedings were published in the paper of this county, by request of the soldiers, on the 27th of July, 1848, and here they are. Again we say, read, read, read: The following Preamble and Resolutions were offered by the returned volunteers, of company H. 2d Pennsylvania Regiment, and

unanimously adopted by the meeting:

WHEREAS, The discharge and arrival home

Geary produced his election by a mere plurality of votel, by FALSE-HOOD and DECEPTION—white he was promising to give Company H the privilege of election their own officers, according to the electing their own officers, according to the laws of the State of P ennsylvania, ho, the edd Geary, bargained with others for votes promising and giving appointments in said Company II, to men from other comprines who might answer his peculiar purposes. The law of Congress of the 18th May, 1846, calling for volunteers for the war with Moxico, has this provision: co. has this provision :

SECT. 5. And be it further enacted, that the said volunteers so offering their services shall be accepted by the President, in companies, battalions, squadrons and regiments, whose officers shall be appointed in the man-ner prescribed by law in the several States and territories to which such companies, buttalions, equalrons and regiments shall respectively belong.

The said Geary, while he availed himself of this law to get himself into a high office, refused the same right to company H which legally and properly belonged to them .-

Therefore,

Resolved, That we, the remaining members of the Fayette county Volunteers, view the conduct of the said John W. Geary towards company H as an ourage upon their just rights, as secured to them by the laws of Penusylvania as well as the laws of Congress.
