Fast Horses, Speed, &c.

FIRST DAY—WEDNESDAY.

First Race.—Premium \$5 00 Running Mules. 3 to start. Best 2 in 3. Half mile heats.

Second Race.—Men's Race. Half mile. Premium \$12. \$6 to 1st; \$4 to 2nd; \$2 to 3rd.

SECOND DAY—THURSDAY.

First Race.—Race for boys under 12 years old. Premium to be divided as follows: \$1 to 1st, 90c to 2nd, 80c to 3rd, 70c to 4th,

60c to 5th, 50c to 6th, 40c to 7th, 30c to 8th, 25c to 9th, 20c to 10th, 15c to 11th, 10c to 12th, 5c to 13th.

Second Race.—For Horses which have never beaten 4 minutes, owned in the county. Mile heats; to harness. Best 3 in 5. 5 to enter; 3 to start. Premium \$20. \$8 to 1st, \$6 to 2nd, \$4 to 3rd, \$2 to 4th.

Third Race.—For county-bred Horses owned in county at time of race. Mile heats; best 3 in 5. To harness. 5 to enter; 3 to start. Premium \$40, as follows: \$22 to 1st, \$14 to 2nd, \$4 to 3rd.

THIRD DAY—FRIDAY.

First Race.—For Horses owned in the following counties: Blair, Huntingdon, Franklin, Dauphin, Snyder, Mifflin, Perry and Juniata. Premium \$225. \$125 to 1st, \$75 to 2nd, \$25 to 3rd. Mile heats; best 3 in 5. To harness. 5 to enter; 3 to start.

Second Race.—For horses which are owned in this county, and which have not beaten 2 minutes and 55 seconds. Premium \$60. \$35 to 1st, \$19 to 2nd, \$5 to 3rd. Mile heats. To harness. Best 3 in 5. 5 to enter; 3 to start.

SACK RACE.

Entries in Sack close Saturday evening, September 18th, 1875, at 6 o'clock. Ten per cent. of premium to accompany all nominations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

There will be a committee appointed to be called the Centennial Committee. This committee will select, purchase and preserve from among the premium articles specimens to be exhibited at the Great Centennial Exposition, to be held in Philadelphia, in 1876.

1st. The field of competition open to all free of charge.

2d. All entries for exhibition must be made prior to 12 o'clock of the first day of the fair. Entries can be made previous to the fair, by addressing the Secretary at Mifflintown, Pa.

Live stock judges are requested to report at the President's office, at 9 o'clock a. m., on Thursday, when they will be furnished with books of entry. All judges of all articles to report at the same office, on Friday, at 9 a. m., and make a return of their award on same day to the Secretary.

Judges, if not satisfied as to the regularity of an entry, or about its coming within the regulations, will apply to the Secretary for information.

When a majority of the judges on any section are present they shall constitute a quorum and are authorized to award premiums.

1. Judges will award no premiums on animals or articles having no competition, unless they are specially worthy.

2. No single article shall be entitled to a premium which has drawn a premium in an assortment, pair, pen, herd, litter or flock.

3. No exhibitor will be permitted to interfere with judges while examining animals or articles shown by such exhibitor. For each offense no premium will be given for such animals or articles.

4. All stock competing for premiums to be owned at least one month by the exhibitor.

Age of horses reckoned from January 1st of the year when foaled.

Entries for speed must be made on or before September 18th, at 6 o'clock p. m.

The Association will furnish hay free to all persons exhibiting stock.

All wagering on the result of any trial of speed is strictly prohibited, and if the owner of any horse shall be concerned in any bet or wager his horse shall be excluded from the course.

All questions respecting the trial of speed shall be determined by the judges, subject to an appeal to the Board of Directors.

No articles or animals shall be removed from the grounds before the close of the exhibition, except by permission of the President.

The Association will carefully preserve all articles while on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any losses or accidents that may occur.

Stalls for horses and cattle, and pens for sheep and hogs, will be furnished free of charge. Experienced hands will be in attendance, to care for stock during the absence of the exhibitor.

Gambling strictly prohibited.

All articles entered for which no provision has been made in the foregoing list, will receive a proportionable premium if deserving.

All articles entered for premium must be reported to the Superintendent of the respective Department before 6 o'clock p. m. of September 22nd.

On Friday afternoon a public sale will be held on the grounds, whereat exhibitors will be permitted to offer for sale articles or stock which may have been exhibited by them, and articles for sale will be so placarded if exhibitors desire it.

Excursion tickets on the Pennsylvania Railroad will be issued between Harrisburg and Altoona.
