Judge Cummin, at the late session of the Leavenworth county court in Williamsport, sentenced Mrs. Stein, who had been convicted of keeping a bawdy house, to \$100 and two years' solitary confinement in the Eastern Penitentiary.

Miss Green, of Tarpot, McKean county, a girl attractive in person and mental charms, trifled with the affections of a saloonkeeper named Dalridge, who sought satisfaction in cold poison. The suction of a stomach pump saved him.

Mrs. Halsey, of Pottsville, has been arrested and put under bail for throwing boiling hot coffee over a seven-year-old daughter, who had offended her. It was proved at the hearing that the child has been frequently beaten in the most brutal manner by her mother.

A farmer of French Creek township, Mercer county, had fifteen sheep killed by dogs. The appraisers awarded him \$18 damages. The commissioners refused to pay on the ground that at the time the sheep were killed the farmer owned a dog, which he had never returned to the assessors.

Julia Hoover was committed to jail at Lancaster on Saturday for trial on the charge of murder. She is supposed to have poisoned her infant sister, at Ephrata, by putting arsenic in cracker boxes. At the hearing Professor T. R. Baker, professor of chemistry at Millersville State Normal School, testified that he found arsenic in the stomach.

Jefferson Egan miraculously escaped death in the South Sixth street tannery at Reading on Friday. While offing the shalting his coat caught and his body was whirled round and round with great velocity. He had the presence of mind to cling to the shaft, and though his head passed within three inches of a brick wall at every revolution he kept it from touching and saved his life. As it was, two of his ribs were broken and the knee caps of both legs were knocked out of their sockets. He was completely stripped of clothing.

Adam Roche, fifty years old, employed at the Continental mine at Scranton, left Taylorville, two miles from here, on Saturday on horseback, with a bottle of vitriol, in his pocket. On the way the bottle broke in his pocket and the acid splashed on his face, and the boy was thrown violently to the ground. The horse went to the mine. Search was instituted for young Roche, and he was found dead beneath a tree, with his clothing torn off and his face, hands and leg badly burned. His eye curled up at the foot of the tree where he had evidently been thrown by the horse and lingered in agony until he died from the effects of his fall.
