Republican Primary System.

The following is the system under which the Republican Primary will be held. First, The candidates for the several offices shall have their names announced in one or more of the Republican county papers at least four weeks previous to the primary meetings, stating the office, and subject to the action of said primary meeting.

AMENDMENTS.

The Republican County Committee, at its meeting of June 19, 1876, proposed an amendment to the first article of the State Constitution, limiting the time of announcement of candidates to two weeks instead of four weeks prior to the Primary Election.

COMMUNICATION.

Editor Sentinel and Republican—Dear Sir, I propose that every candidate for the Legislature should be required before the nomination to give a pledge to the people, that is, to the tax-payers and voters, that if he be chosen and elected to the House of the people's representatives, that he will use his best abilities to have a law passed to amend the Constitution of Pennsylvania so as to reduce the number of members to 100, and the Senate to 25, as it used to be.
