MILK DENSITY.—Warm one quart of milk, and cut up into it a quarter of a pound of butter, stir well together and let it cool; then add half a cup of salt, a teaspoonful of salt and as much sifted flour as will make a dough stiff enough to roll. Let it stand in a warm place until quite hot, then roll out on a smooth table, and cut into small round cakes. Place them on buttered tins, and let them bake again; stick each one with a fork, and bake twenty minutes in a quick oven.
