Chicago, Ill., Sept. 14.—The Supreme Court this morning at Ottawa delivered an opinion in the case of the Anarchists, affirming the judgment of the court below, and ordered the execution to take place on November 11, between 9 and 4 o'clock. The opinion, which was delivered by Justice Magruder, was very elaborate, embracing nearly 60,000 words. The decision was announced as unanimous, though Judge McKelvey explained that, while it was not his intention to offer a separate opinion, he only desired to say that he did not wish to be understood as holding that the record was free from error, for he did not think it was. He was nevertheless of the opinion that none of the errors complained of were of such serious character as to require a reversal of the judgment. He said:

In short, after having fully examined the record and given the questions arising on it my very best thought, with an earnest and conscientious desire to faithfully discharge my whole duty, I am fully satisfied that the opinion reached vindicates the law and does complete justice between the people of the State and the defendants, fully warranted by the law and the evidence.

McCabe captured.

The similarity to a certain degree in the escape of William Josiah McMeen from the Mifflintown jail, and the escape of McCabe from the Wayne county jail, has awakened no little interest in Juniata county, in McCabe's case. The circumstances of the capture of the two men are somewhat alike. The Philadelphia Times of last week related as follows, the capture of the murderer, James P. McCabe, the murderer of Major and Riley, who escaped from the Wayne County jail the 18th of May last, was this morning, September 13th, captured in a barn in Preston township, about three miles from the town of the capture, which was committed in December 1885. During the past four weeks a posse of men have been searching the woods of country in the vicinity of McCabe's home. So closely has he been hunted that he has crossed the Moccasin mountain and took refuge in the coal regions. He did not remain there long but soon returned to the neighborhood of his home, where he has been hiding ever since his escape.

Being in possession of the information that McCabe had returned to Preston township Sheriff Medland and Deputy Clark organized a posse of about fifty men, which was started on the 12th of September, and proceeded to search for McCabe. They were to move upon a certain locality from three different points. The work of searching barns and dwellings commenced on the 12th of September, and McCabe was discovered by constable Martin, of Preston, in the hay loft of a barn belonging to Martin Clune. The officer went into the hay loft, and upon seeing the prisoner, he called out, "McCabe, get up!" McCabe ascended into the hay loft and just as McCabe was in the act of getting up they covered him with their revolvers and ordered him to throw up his hands.

"About 11 o'clock," he answered. "He was at once handcuffed and brought to the county jail, where he is again under the guard of two watchmen. A five shilling watchman found McCabe in the pocket of his coat. When asked why he did not attempt to use it, he said that the officers surprised him. He heard the noise they made in the barn, but thought it was caused by the old farmer, who had come out to see his sheep. The day fixed for his execution is October 6. The Sheriff allows no one to see him. He is very quiet and has nothing to say to anyone. He will not disclose whether or not he is satisfied with his capture. McCabe made his escape from the Wayne County Jail eight days before the day set for his execution and at the time when the Board of Prisoners were considering his case. His escape was made it is supposed between 3 and 4 o'clock in the morning. The watchman fell asleep and the condemned murderer let himself out of his cell and made his way to the hay loft of the jail. The cell in which McCabe was confined was lined with iron, and the door was secured by a heavy lock held by four bolts. These had been removed by McCabe, and he had cut his way through the door. The Sheriff's men followed up. Finally the matter dragged and very little attention was given toward his capture. Within the past two weeks however, Sheriff Medland was informed that McCabe was seen in the vicinity of his home, Pleasant Mt. and a posse under Deputy Sheriff Clark made an effort to catch him, but he got away. The sheriff upon being warned by some friends, later he was traced to Carbonate and a search there failed to discover him, and next he was heard of near Jefferson, Pa. McCabe was captured by the men who were after him the slip.
