



C. dated on the 27th, ult., says: Some curious earthquake phenomena have just been discovered in an isolated section between Summerville and Charleston, which bears terrible evidences of being one of three foes of the great shock of August, 1883 The ground for miles is literally overturned. In consequence there are to be seen many deep pits on the margin of which have been thrown up pure white sand as is seen only on the seashore. On the white sand thus upheaved has sprung up a dense growth of sea plants such as is found on the tops of the white sand hills created by the wind currents on the islands of this coasts It is evident that the seeds from which these plants have sprung have been ejected from great depths, where they have doubtless been buried many senturies without losing their germinating powers."


