A noted prison official has stated that "Prison life is a luxury." With certain chances and exceptions the loss of liberty, this is plain to all. A large percentage of criminals, after serving one, two or three terms, seek another conviction, showing the system does not reform, and the sentence of the law in some State conveys to their minds no unpleasant emotions.

The prison contractor pays but one-sixth or one-eighth of outside prices for labor, only enough to feed the prisoner, and in addition, the State furnishes the buildings free of charge for rent, repairs, insurance or taxes, and they place these prison productions in the market below the paying point, while the State or Company in which these penal institutions are situated.
