
SECTION 2. And be it further enacted. That if, by or under the authority of the Con atitution or laws of any State, or the laws of any Territory, any act is or shall be required to be done as a prerequisite or qualification for voting, and by such Constitution or law persons or officers are or shall be charged with the performance of duties in furnishing to citizens an opportunity to perform such prorequisite to become qualified to vote, it shall be the duty of every person and officer to give all citizens of the United States the same and equal

opportunity to perform such prerequisite and to become qualified to vote without distinction of race, color or previous condition of servitude, and if any such person or officer shall retuse or knowingly omit to give full effect to this section, he shall, for every per day by its use. such offence, forfeit and pay the sum of five hundred dollars to the person aggriered thereby, to be recovered by an action on the case, with full costs and such allowance for counsel fees as the court shall deem just, and shall also for every such offence be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be fined not less than five hundred dollars or be imprisoned not eas than one month nor more than one year. or both, at the discretion of the court


