THE CENSUS IN FERMANAGH TOWNSHIP.

The unofficial census report of Fermanagh township, 1890, represents 27 soldiers against rebellion, living, of whom hold two discharge papers; two soldiers' widows have remarried; one widow draws a pension; one mother of a son, a deceased soldier draws a pension. There are one hundred and five farms in the township. Eight manufacturing establishments, such as saw mills, grist mills, stave and shingle mills. The population of the township is 965, which is 149 less than in 1880, which is owing to the abandonment of mining in the township. Six deaths have taken place in this census year. There are 92,446 peach trees in the township, of which number 17,200 reached their fruit bearing age in the census year.
