Pensions for the Militia.

Congressman Atkinson has offered a bill in Congress having for its object the pensioning of the Pennsylvania militia. The Pennsylvania militia entered the field animated by the highest patriotic motive. They were not offered pay. They were not in dread of death. They were not in dread of draft. They were not engaged in the field of battle does not detract in the least from the patriotic purpose for which they took up arms. Men cannot enter a service for a higher and nobler motive than that which animated the Pennsylvania Militia when they took up arms to repel the rebel invasions of 1862 and 1863. But the Militia went not out for military fame or glory, not for bounty, not for pension.

Some days ago President Harrison sent a long message to Congress on the Chilean difficulty, reviewing the situation, but it makes nothing clear as to the provocation that led to the mobbing of United States sailors. The mobbing took place on the 16th day of October, 1891, in the city of Valparaiso, which that day was visited by 117 sailors of the United States man of war, Baltimore. The sailors were on a special business further than sight seeing goes and for the benefit of a change of life from ship for a day's exercise on land. It is not known according to the President's message just how the trouble between the sailors and Chileans began. One report has it that the quarrel was started in a tavern between two sailors and from the tavern the quarrel got out into the street. Another report is that the quarrel was occasioned by a Chilean sailor spitting in the face of an American sailor which the American resented by knocking the Chilean down, and that led to the Chileans mobbing every American sailor that wore an American uniform. Eighteen American sailors were brutally stabbed and beaten and one killed, while only one Chilean was seriously hurt. The Americans had no weapons with them. The President has laid the whole matter in a documentary form before Congress. The message is in the hands of the House Committee on Foreign Relations. Meanwhile Chile has assented to an apology and will do almost anything to extricate herself from the difficulty.

She will apologize over and over and if need, be hand the whole difficulty over to the Supreme Court of the United States to sit and determine where, when and how the trouble began, and how much damage.
