On the Cutting and Removal of Timber.

The Perry County Freeman of June 6, says—On Monday Judge Lyons heard the testimony and arguments in the case of A. B. Briley vs. D. Gring. This was a bill in equity and writ of injunction brought to restrain the defendant and the Elk Training Co. from removing the bark, trees and lumber from a tract of some 8,000 acres of land in the upper end of the county.

The allegations were that none of the purchase money had been paid, and the defendants by removing the timber and bark were taking away the only security they had, as the land without timber and bark was valueless, and they asked the Court to declare D. Gring insolvent and to restrain him or any others under him from removing any more bark or lumber.
