CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—The returns received by the Associated Press up to midnight indicate the probable election of McKinley and Hobart, although returns are not complete as a number of doubtful states that this conclusion can only be reached by an estimate based upon the gains and losses.

Boller, James Gay, George B. and Charles B. McMichaels, all of Philadelphia; Fifth district, Robert S. Fraser, Allegheny; Sixth district, Emory A. Walling, Erie county; Twenty-seventh district, John Add Malvern, Washington county.

Mckinley has carried Allegheny by about 40,000, a Republican gain of 50,000. C. L. Magoo, for state senator, who probably has a majority over Phelan of 3,000. The entire legislative ticket, with the exception of one assemblyman, has been carried by the Republican ticket, who have the same proportion as the head of the ticket. Congressman John A. Stone, in the Twenty-third district, have been re-elected. The vote in the county was the heaviest in its history.

State senators were elected in twenty-five districts in the commonwealth today. Based on the returns thus far received the next senate will stand: Republicans, 44; Democrats, 6. Of the holdover senators, seven Republicans and one Democrat.
