## Home for German Baptists.

The Lancaster, Pa., Court last Thursday granted a charter for the establishment of a Home for the homeless of the German Baptist Brethren.

A farm has been purchased for \$5,000 in Rapahoe township near Manheim, and paid for by the members of the church advancing the money.
