Wheat in Chicago sold at \$1.50 a bushel last Thursday. The oats sown in March presents a satisfactory appearance.

Wheat rose in Philadelphia last Thursday to \$1.24 a bushel. The price of wheat in Chicago on Tuesday May 10, was \$1.75.

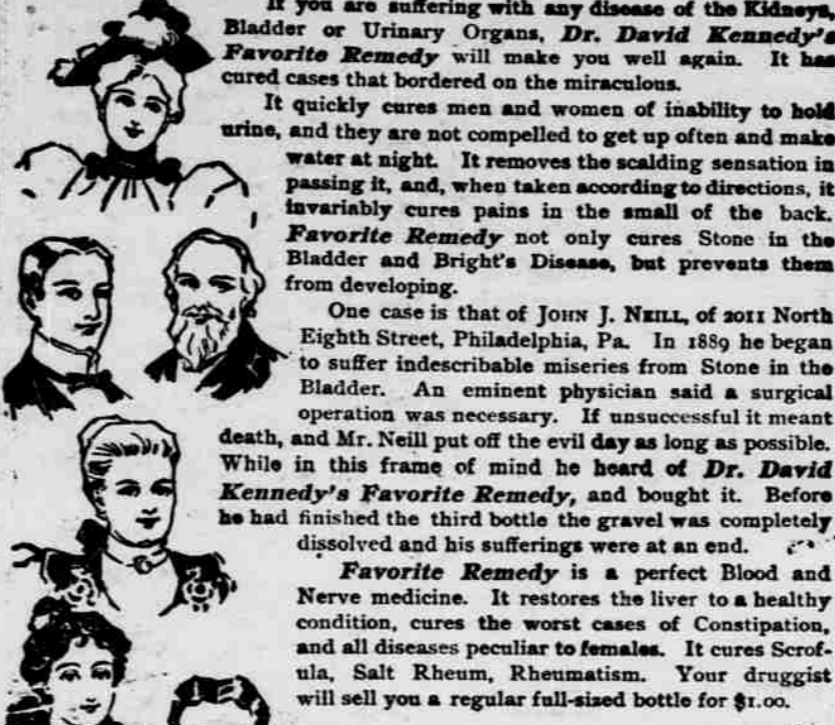
