WAR ON LAND AND SEA.

Tuesday, July 26 1898, was another great day in the history of the army and navy of the United States. Between daylight and 11 o'clock a. m., that day the army under General Miles, and under protection of war ships began to land on the island of Porto Rico.

The landing of troops was affected at Guanica, a town of 1000 inhabitants on the south side of the island. The harbor here is said to be deep enough to admit heavy ships within 200 feet of shore.
