which the several candidates shall present their names. The costs and expenses of the Return Judges' convention shall be borne by the successful candidate.

Each candidate for nomination for the several offices must present to the County Chairman at least twenty days before the date fixed for the primary election, his full name, district, post-office address, and the office for which he desires to be a candidate.

The County Chairman shall be required to present to his constituents an itemized statement of the receipts and expenditures of the primary, and the Chairman receiving the same before the County Chairman at its first meeting.

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shall appoint a committee of three representatives to fill all vacancies which may occur on the ticket from any cause whatever.

No action was taken upon the rules by the convention, but they will lie over till next year when the voters of the party will vote upon the question of adopting them or not.

The President and Secretaries of the Convention were appointed a committee to fill any vacancies that may occur on the ticket, from any reason, between the date of the convention and the day of election.
