of the first day of the Fair, if possible. They must be entered and on the grounds at ten o'clock of the second day. No animal can compete for two premiums except in a herd.

The officers of the Society and Superintendents will be known by their official badges. A sufficient police force will be in attendance from 9 o'clock of the first day until after the reading of the premiums the second day; to protect the property of exhibitors.

No provision will be made for stalling stock over two years old. Persons exhibiting full blood animals for premiums must leave the pedigrees of their stock with the Secretary for the consideration of the Judges thereon.

All stock exhibited as a herd must be owned by the exhibitor. Any member of a committee who shall own or have an interest in any article submitted for decision of said committee shall withdraw from said committee; and if any person owning or having any interest in any animal or article entered for premium, shall appear before the committee while examining the same without having first been requested by said committee, it shall be their duty to exclude such animal or article from competition.

The Judges shall in all cases withhold premiums when the animals or articles are not worthy, though there be no competition. No intoxicating drinks allowed to be sold on the grounds. Judges reporting at the Secretary's office before 11 o'clock will receive a ticket for dinner.

Price for Admission. Single tickets, 25 cents; children under 12 years, 10 cents; team, 25 cents; single horse, 25 cents; colts under two years; clergy members and their families admitted free.
