

FARMERS' DEPARTMENT.

Facts for Mechanics. St. Paul was a mechanic; a tent-maker. Our Saviour was a mechanic; a carpenter.

Next to farmers, mechanics are the most numerous and the most important class of the community. Whatever promotes their interests, of course promotes the interests of the public.

Every mechanic in every operation, brings into use some principles of science; which principle it is of course, his interest, and his convenience to understand.

Young animals grow quickly for a given amount of food than older. By high feeding, a lamb of Southdown breed, (not a large sort) may be 15 or 16 pounds a quarter at a year old.

When an animal is in good condition it yields a greater produce for its food than when it is poor and lean.

If, therefore, an animal be first fed on good pasture till it is fresh and fat, and then removed to poor keeping so as to lose its condition, not only is the food wholly lost on which it declined in flesh, but all the good food which it may consume for some time afterward has very much less effect.

Horizontal Plowing. Side hills ought always to be plowed with a horizontal furrow, instead of running it up and down, or slanting it towards the bottom of the hill with too great an inclination.

When a farmer should be. A farmer should be well instructed in chemistry generally, more particularly as applied to agriculture; should be well versed in mineralogy, geology, botany, and in the physiology of weeds, plants, trees and animals, including the species of humans; he should learn geometry, mensuration, &c.
