

More British Public Sentiment.

Blackwood's Magazine is the great Tory Magazine of England. The July number of that periodical contains one of a series of letters written by an Englishman who is traveling in this country. On page 45 of the July number, 1852, will be found the following paragraph in relation to American politics:

"A much more important question is the tariff, and it is one which will enter into every political combination. It has not of late been put very prominently forward; but it is one of the most important that the American Government can take on itself. The tariff of America cannot exist under competition with England under a higher tariff, and the simple question is, whether manufactures shall cease or not. I may return to the subject in a subsequent letter; but I shall now remark only, that while the East, as the great manufacturing district, has been generally in favor of higher duties, the West and the South have been adverse. A change, however, is taking place in this respect. Manufacture is increasing in the West, especially since large mines have been operated upon, and has sprung up in the South. Neither is it exclusively agricultural as it was; and there has been hardly a President making speech for the last six months which has not had some allusion to the necessity of an increased tariff. This is significant. The question is properly stated. It is whether manufacturers shall cease or not, since it is no doubt true that, 'the manufacturers of America cannot exist under competition with England under a higher tariff.' This fact explains why the English are opposed to any modification of the present tariff and why they are in favor of Pierce's election. They wish American manufactures destroyed, so that England may supply with manufacturers, may derive heavy profits from the trade and gorge her already overgrown money-lords with the proceeds of the sale of American workingmen. Pierce and his party are pledged to this policy—which, if persisted in, will give England the position she desires and make America a mere tributary to British workshops.

In Northampton his native county, he also runs ahead of his ticket by a handsome vote. In Washington county, where Hopkins resides (which generally gives 200 Democratic majority, Hoffman has a majority of 60. These results go to show the estimation in which the rival candidates are held where they are best known.






