



The Farm and the Fireside.

How to weigh Live Cattle.

This is of some utility to all those who are not experienced judges by eye. By the following directions, the weight can be ascertained within a mere trifle.

Take a string and put it round the breast, stand square, just behind the shoulder blade; measure on a foot rule the feet and inches the animal is in circumference; this is called the girth; then, with the string, measure from the base of the tail which plumbs the line with the hindquarters of the buttock; direct the line along the back to the shoulder blade; take the dimensions on foot, then rule as before, which is the length, and work the figures in the following manner: Girth the bullock, six feet four inches; length, five feet three inches—which multiplied together make 31 square superficial feet; and that multiplied by 13 (the number of pounds measures less than five in girth) make 713 pounds.

Again, suppose a pig or any small beast should measure seven feet in girth, and two along the back, which multiplied together, make 4 square feet; that multiplied by 11, the number of pounds allowed each square foot, of cattle measuring less than three feet in girth, make 44 pounds. Again, suppose a calf, a sheep &c., should measure 4 feet six inches in girth, and 3 feet 9 inches in length; which multiplied together makes 15 3/4 square feet; that multiplied by 16, the number of pounds allowed to all cattle measuring less than five feet, and more than three in girth, make 265 pounds.

How to make a Cistern.—For a cistern to hold 25 barrels of water, procure one barrel of water lime, (hydraulic cement) and three barrels of clean coarse sand.

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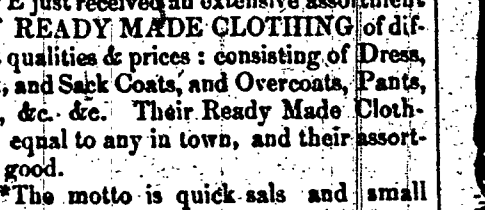
