U. S. Mail steamship Pacific, which left Liverpool on Wednesday, April 19, at 2 P. M., arrived at New York, Monday morning about 9 o'clock.

THE BALTIC—CAPTURES OF THE FIRST RUSSIAN PRIZES. The London Times of the 17th published the following telegraphic despatch from its Copenhagen correspondent, and the British press caused much excitement.

Russia has offered to equip to the value of 300,000 Roubles, every Eshonian gentleman who will enter the army. The Grand Duke Alexander, the heir presumptive to the Russian crown, is about to visit Germany, and to make a long stay, at the first instance at Berlin, and afterwards at Darmstadt.

THE BLACK SEA—BLOCKADE OF ODESSA. Varna, April 1.—The fleets have left in the direction of Sevastopol.

THE ABOVE are the only authentic announcements received of the movements of the fleets, but our information has come out by private despatches. It was rumored that the bulk of the fleet had gone to Sevastopol, but it was more likely it had gone to Odessa.

THE ENGLISH STEAMER Sampson, which has been surveying on the coast of Greece, returned to Constantinople on March 21, bringing intelligence of a complete victory gained by the Grecians over the Russians, and after a severely contested battle drove them into their capital on the coast.

THE GREEK FIRMS in London, Liverpool, and Manchester were reported to have contributed funds in aid of the insurrection against Turkey. The Manchester firms were said to have subscribed £10,000 sterling.

THE SHIP Cambaja, Perry, master, from New Orleans, arrived at Queenstown with three of the crew of the shipwrecked British bark Westminster from Honduras to Cork, they being the only survivors of a crew of 100.

SALARIES OF UNITED STATES PUBLIC OFFICERS. The compensation of the following public officers of the United States is presented by law at the amounts stated.

President of the United States, \$25,000 per annum; Vice President, \$5,000; Secretary of State, Treasury, Navy, and War, each, \$6,000 per annum; Chief Justice of the United States, \$5,000; Associate Justices, \$4,500 per annum.

Consuls of the United States, generally so called, are in effect agents for commerce and seamen. They receive no yearly salaries, (except at London, Paris, Tangier, Tunis, and Tripoli, where they have an annual salary of \$2,500), and their compensation is derived from fees which they are allowed by law.
