THE NEBRASKA BILL PASSED. It is with satisfaction that we refer to what we have said of the Nebraska bill, that which a House of Representatives as we have at Washington there was very great danger of its success. Yesterday the bill passed by 113 votes to 100, a meagre majority it is true, and meagre as it was, artificial and factitious majority, in which more votes were at variance with their convictions. The Administration have been actively and openly canvassing for the bill, and the members of the House were sent to the Committee of the Whole. The Washington Star, one of the journals which the measure has all along been sustained, spoke only two or three days since of the general rumor that clerks in the public offices were to be conferred upon the friends of members who voted for the bill—a rumor which was treated as authentic, and which nobody has taken the trouble to deny or discredit. It is evident, it is understood that all the influence, the underground and solicitation has been exerted by the President to secure the passage of the bill. But for this influence, the measure would have found in the House the ignominious end it deserved.

Of the dishonor which a measure reopening to the barbarous institution of Slavery a vast region closed against it for the past part of a century, must bring upon our country, we have already said. There is no other point of view in which we must now either killing or not, look at the question. The President has taken a course, by which the greater part of this dishonor is concentrated on the Democratic party. Upon him and his administration, and upon all the northern friends of the Nebraska bill in Congress, and upon the Democratic party who gave the present Executive his power of mischief, the people will visit this great political sin of the day. The Whigs of the gullible have taken credit to their skirts. Their Representatives in Congress to a man, voted against the Nebraska bill, as if they had agreed among themselves that the Democratic party of the North should take and bear the entire responsibility of the measure. The result is inevitable; Seaward is in the ascendency in this State and the North generally; the Democratic party has lost its moral strength in the free States; it is stripped of the respect of the people by the misconduct of those who represent it; and the Whigs, who have been honest, will make of our excellent maxims of legislation and policy in regard to other questions, the deed of yesterday put in a minority for years to come. Let it be remembered that there are two classes of men at the North whose resentment is awakened by this proceeding—that is to say, those who acquiesced in the Compromise of 1850 and those who did not. The latter class relied upon the promise made with such emphasis to the Whigs in Mr. Fremont's inaugural speech, that the agitation of the Slavery question should never be revived during the continuance of his Administration; if any power which he could exert might prevent it. In the very teeth of this engagement they have seen him consent to be made an instrument for reviving this agitation, wantonly, without necessity, without any urgency on the part of the South, not less so than thoughtless, but with the most deliberate premeditation. Not only the enemies of the Compromise of 1850, therefore, but its very friends at the North are deeply offended. My Mr. Fillmore sacrificed his popularity by the part he took in the legislation of 1850; if he saw himself in consequence, excluded from a nomination to the Presidency two years afterward, his partisan associates, compelled to go into private life, and the Whig party deflated and broken up, still may we expect the retribution of this still greater political transgression to be!

Still more strongly will the public disapprobation and disappointment be expressed, if the people shall see, as they probably will, that the admission of Slavery into Nebraska is the preparation for yet other measures having in view the aggrandizement of the slave power—the wresting of Cuba from Spain to several additional slave States; the creation of new slave States, in territory acquired from Mexico, and the annexation of the African slave trade. These things are contemplated; the southern journals already speak of them as familiarly and flippantly as they do of an ordinary appropriation bill, and who shall say that they are not already at our door? When we think of how improvable it seemed at first, that the Nebraska fraud would become a law—which we reflect what pledges have been broken, what expectations have been disappointed, and how the public opinion of the country has been flouted in the vote procured for it—what measure is there, of the same nature, to foul or to audacious to be expected from the present Congress, now in the midst of its first session?

We hope, for our part, that none of these methods of opposition to the series of measures which we fear, is the preliminary will be left untried. The members of Congress who have opposed it, will we hope, have a word to say to their constituents, and the nation, in such energetic terms as the greatness of the occasion makes proper. The people will also, we fully believe, do their part. We hope to see a host of emigrants, under the auspices of Fremont's Emigration Societies—a living swarm of free laborers from our older States and from Europe—settling upon the territory of Kansas the moment the country is open to them, and occupying the region in favor of liberty.

Further intelligence from Halifax brought by the steamer America has come to hand. The British fleet after throwing some bombs at Sebastopol, without reply, stationed a few ships there to keep guard and some to the Asiatic coast of the Black Sea. Russia will attack Silistria by water, and has stationed 70,000 men on the frontier of Bessarabia and Transylvania, which latter step will compel immediate attention from Austria. In Parliament Lord Ellenborough has called attention to the enormous expense of £2,000,000, already incurred for the transportation of troops. A camp of 50,000 men now forming at St. Omer in France, is said to be destined for Finland, to operate with Sweden against Russia. There was a report from Paris that the Emperor Napoleon had written the King of Greece, commanding him to desist from operating against Turkey, and threatening to occupy Greece with French Troops if the King did not immediately attend to it. Twelve British troops are said to have been detailed for that service. Persia has declared against Russia, and demands a restitution of her captured provinces.

Will Sars.—In the course of his able and excellent speech on the Nebraska bill, Hon. Wm.
