

Row at Sing Sing.
An insurrection occurred among the convicts at Sing Sing last Thursday which resulted in the death of one person and the severe wounding of another. The leader of this movement was a desperado named Tom Kelly who made an attempt to escape recently, since which he has had a ball and chain attached to one of his legs. Thursday he managed to free himself from this impediment, and giving a signal which appears to have been preconcerted, he started towards the prison dock. A desperate encounter ensued on board the sloop, between Kelly and several convicts who followed him on one side, and the prison keepers and the crew of the sloop on the other. The insurrectionists were finally secured, after having mortally stabbed the captain of the sloop and desperately wounded one of the keepers.


